


FROM THE FINANCE OFFICE

WORK EXPOSURE IN GOVERNMENT RECIPIENT

Jessie Sandford, Year 10 was one of 70 ATSI students from around Australia chosen to attend the WEX, Work Exposure in Government held in Canberra from 20 to 25 October. This initiative supports Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students in Years 10, 11 and 12 to gain experience and gain information about job opportunities and career pathways in the Australian Government. Jessie was met by WEX mentors at the airport and stayed at Canberra's Rex Hotel. On arrival, Jessie received a welcome gift of a goodie bag and met the other student recipients, mentors and facilitators from around Australia.

The students visited the Australian Defence Force Academy, the Australian Federal Police headquarters, the Australian War Memorial, the Australian Institute of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Studies, a tour of Parliament House and a Careers Expo.

"A highlight of the week was Parliamentary question time at Parliament House where we had the best view, from 'The Chamber' it was really interesting and I learnt a lot about how our Government works," said Jessie. "Seeing the excellent facilities at the Military College, meeting an Aboriginal elder at the Tent Embassy and meeting our Prime Minister, Scott Morrison made the whole experience amazing.'

NURIOOTPA HIGH SCHOOL BUSHFIRE PROCEDURES

On days where Bureau of Meteorology has forecast catastrophic fire danger rating for the Mount Lofty Ranges district:

- Nuriootpa High School is within an area classified by the CFS as a Bushfire Safer Place and will remain open
- School bus routes to Nuriootpa High School for affected regions will be cancelled
- Parents/Caregivers of students who travel on affected buses will be contacted via SMS, voice call, Daymap and notification through our website
- More information can be obtained via the Department for Education Emergency Information Hotline on 1800 000 279

If a bushfire is reported in our region during the day:

- Affected bus routes will be cancelled and will not leave the school until the area is declared safe by emergency services
- Parents/caregivers of students who travel on buses will be contacted via SMS, voice call, Daymap and notification through our Website
- Students will be supervised at Nuriootpa High School until buses can run or parents/caregivers are able to collect students
- In a bushfire emergency be aware that mobile services may be interrupted and communication may cease

If during a bus run, the driver sights a bushfire and there is a concern for safety, then the bus driver:

- Has the authority to abandon the bus route and return to school, or
- If it is safe to do so, proceed to one of the pre-planned emergency areas or CFS designated 'Safer Places'

To support student safety, parents/caregivers are asked to:

- Ensure that their contact information is up to date and correct so Nuriootpa High School staff are able to contact them in an emergency
- Ensure that they do not place themselves or others at risk when attempting to collect their child from Nuriootpa High School
- Be up-to-date with the Bureau of Meteorology (BOM) extreme weather announcements and tune into emergency broadcasters ABC Radio 891 or the CFS website <u>https://www.cfs.sa.gov.au/site/home.jsp</u>

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Dear Parents/Caregivers

Re: School Closures and Cancelled School Bus and Taxi Runs on days of Catastrophic Fire Danger Ratings

A number of our school managed School Buses and Taxis will <u>not</u> run when a Catastrophic (Code Red) Fire Danger Rating is declared for the <u>Mt Lofty, Murraylands or Mid North Fire Ban Districts</u>. The SA Government/DECD policy is that schools will close, and school buses and taxis will not run, in designated fire ban districts when those districts have a declared fire danger rating of <u>Catastrophic (Code Red)</u>.

Nuriootpa High School is <u>not</u> in an affected fire ban district and <u>will</u> remain open. However, the following buses and taxis <u>do</u> travel into the above fire ban districts and therefore are <u>not</u> permitted to operate on Catastrophic (Code Red) days for that district.

While these buses and taxis are not permitted to run, students affected <u>are</u> permitted to attend school but transport to and from school on that day would be at the discretion and responsibility of their parents/caregivers.

As per our guidelines, an **ADVANCE WARNING** bulletin will be provided two days before a possible bus run cancellation.

It is possible that the CFS/weather bureau will declare Catastrophic (Code Red) at <u>very short notice</u> and it may not be possible to issue this advanced warning.

Information will also be provided via the school answering machine, website and noticeboard. It is essential that all families also monitor the media and public broadcasts and warnings associated with bushfire warning and with taking control of their own bushfire safety and preparedness. Families can also contact the parent hotline, 1800 000 279, which will operate the day before and throughout bus run cancellation periods when the Catastrophic (Code Red) level bushfire weather is forecast.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation as we work together to keep our children safe.

EMERGENCY FOOD RELIEF

Nuriootpa High School continues to be extremely grateful to businesses and not-for-profit organisations that support our school community through emergency food relief.

Our school has again been successful with an application through The Co-op Sponsorship Program – Round 2, 2019 to support the provision of fruit for all students via the Fruit Bowl located in Student Support.

Further local support is available through Kind-Hearted Kitchen, who make and supply ready-made meals to offer to those within our school community – and the wider community – who require some



extra support from time to time. There is no criteria to access the meals, and according to co-founder Ruby Stobart "You need a meal, you get a meal". Meals can be accessed via the school's Wellbeing Team.

KickStart for Kids (KSFK) also continues to provide food for our Breakfast Club (milk, bread, fresh and canned fruit, yoghurt/fruit purees, eggs, jam, Marmite, and margarine), as well as for emergency lunches (cheese sandwiches). In support of KSFK's 'Happy Day' to raise funds to continue their valuable work, the SRC was able to donate \$500 from the proceeds of a Casual Day late last term.

And just recently, Foodbank SA has approached our school to promote their Mobile Food Hub that sets up behind Lutheran Community Care (2 Second Street, Nuriootpa) on the last Monday of each month. This is a referral-only program, where families can access vouchers via the school for free and low-cost food, sanitary and hygiene items, everyday essentials and animal food.

Parent Update Week 3, Term 4 - 2019

Your child's wellbeing is important

Your child's wellbeing is just as important in high school as it is in primary school.

We know from our high schools that already have year 7s and from interstate learnings that year 7s look forward to the excitement, challenges and broader opportunities that high school brings. Watch the <u>video</u> on our website to see how year 7s are thriving at Clare High School.

Support will be available

Schools will help year 7s adjust to new routines and different academic demands for starting high school in 2022. They will be given evidence about what works to support early adolescents to feel safe and confident. The supports will vary across schools, so it's best to check with your new high school about how transition will work.

Schools also have frameworks in place to manage interactions between students of different ages. These already operate in our B-12, R-12, area and primary schools to manage younger children interacting with older students.

It's a big year for our year 8s

In 2022, year 7 and 8 students will begin high school in the same year for the first time. We are very mindful of having a smooth transition for all new high school students. Our year 7s and year 8s will receive appropriate support when starting high school for the first time in 2022.

Primary schools will be thinking about graduation and transition practices, and high schools will be planning open days and transition activities ahead of the move.


