



From the Principal By Gerri Walker



Welcome to 2022 – a year that has started with excitement and a range of challenges including hybrid teaching.

We have had a great start to the year, welcoming about 200 Year 7 students (5 in the Unit, 2 in our Special class and 193 in mainstream) and 196 Year 8 students (5 in the Unit, 4 in the Special class and 187 in the mainstream). Given the staggered start, the new Year 7s and 8s had a great opportunity to find their way around the school and begin their timetable in a less crowded environment – it has been a very positive start for these students.

With 26 new teachers, it was wonderful to have the extra 2 days for preparation to enable us to support these staff to understand our online learning model and orientate themselves around the school. All teachers were allocated a classroom to work from so that mixing was minimised. SSOs were also allocated a space. This was a bit challenging for new staff, but we provided them with buddies and Leaders/Executive members were also available.

With respect to **COVID restrictions**, from next week, the following can happen:

- Day excursions and incursions (held outdoors where possible). *Please note that some excursion venues may have vaccination requirements*
- Interschool sporting competitions
- Extra-curricular activities at the school, including choirs, band practice, instrumental lessons attended by a non-school employed music teacher
- Work experience and work placements
- Camps and other outdoor activities required by the SACE for the purpose of subjects such as Outdoor Education

COVID-19 settings that remain in place

- Face masks continue to be required (when indoors) for:
 - ~ all adults, except when it impedes ability to teach
 - ~ students in Years 7 to 12
- Current <u>testing</u>, <u>isolating</u> and <u>quarantine</u> remains unchanged, including classroom contacts
- Non-SACE related overnight camps continue to be postponed

The majority of students are wearing their masks correctly (over their mouth AND nose). Please remind your student of this requirement to support the school staff. Thank you for the support that we have been given by you to make our school site COVID safe.

Students engaged in School Based Apprenticeship or Traineeships and hence, on a career trajectory, are almost three times higher than the State average.

SRC, House Captains and Peer Support Leaders

Last Friday we had our first whole school assembly for 2022 – via Teams! We recognised our student leaders for this year and presented badges to the SRC, House Captains and Peer Support Leaders (60 of these working across Years 7 and 8). These students play a vital role at our school. They give up their time to contribute to our school community while developing their leadership skills. The school community acknowledges and thanks these students for their contributions.

The presentations occurred in different venues with COVID safe practices, using a Spotlight' approach via Teams. Our Year 7 and 8 students have now had several school events via Teams – we are really looking forward to seeing all students together in one space.

Presentation of Badges to Years 7 and 8 Students

To mark the extraordinary occasion of Year 7 moving to high school in South Australia, the government provided each Year 7 and 8 student and Home Group teacher with a 'Class of 2022' commemorative badge. We did this via Teams with a student from each class presenting the Home Group teacher with a badge and then the Home Group teacher presenting every student with a badge. The Year Level team staff also were presented with a badge.

Mobile Phone Policy

This policy continues to be implemented with very few students having their phones removed.

Facilities Update Quad Buildings (Modulars)

- * These are the 8 classrooms that are the hub of the Year 7 teaching. The students go to specialist facilities for some subjects and have the remainder of their classes in these classrooms.
- * On day 1, 6 of the 8 classrooms were operational with the last 2 coming online the next day
- * There are still some minor works continuing to be completed but the rooms are looking great.

Multi-Purpose Building

This new building comprises:

- 2 Art Rooms
- * A PE fitness room still need to mount the weights
- * Performing Arts room this is a great space with a sound and lights table and good storage area for costumes and smaller props
- Performing Arts classroom
- Music Performance room
- Teacher Prep room

Staff are really excited about the new facilities.

The Hospitality Teaching Space has been upgraded to be able to take a full class of students – it looks great.

There is also a new Technical Studies room that has a focus for the junior school students.

Inclusive Education Centre

- * The two new classrooms are operational with some very useful breakout spaces. They are a very effective teaching space.
- * The dividing fence between the existing and new buildings will remain in place until the new playground area is done
- * There will be 2 new long jump tracks and pits built on the side of the oval near the town oval to replace those that were removed due to this build.

Home Ec Upgrade

The school is paying to have one of the Home Ec classrooms upgraded. Progress for this is:

- Joinery has been installed
- Tiling, electrical/plumbing second fix, painting, pinboards now being done
- * Floor coverings organized to be installed 28 Feb 3 March
- * Install the new ovens on Friday 4 March

All going well, they are planning to be able to have handover of the internal area on COB Friday 4 March, ready for use Monday 7 March.

We are looking forward to a successful year at Nuriootpa High School in 2022 – the first year that we are a Year 7 to 12 Secondary school with 4 Disability Unit classes and 3 Special classes. We will achieve this in partnership with parents and the wider school community.






