Discover Your Future

The decisions that young people make at school have a big impact on their lives – affecting not just their further education, training or employment, but also their social lives, finances and health outcomes.



Current research shows that there is a challenge to prepare young people for a working life that is radically different from that of previous generations. Numerous reports have raised awareness of the types of knowledge, skills and attributes that young people will need to manage a successful career in the rapidly changing world of work. There are a range of skills that have been identified as needed in the future.

These include:

- Critical thinking and problem-solving
- Collaboration across networks and leading by influence
- Agility and adaptability
- Initiative and entrepreneurialism
- Effective oral and written communication
- Accessing and analysing information
- Curiosity and imagination

A key function of secondary schools is to prepare students to transition successfully toward a future career path. This involves providing curriculum opportunities to build students' general capabilities, support students' interests and aspirations, and support them to make informed decisions about their subject choices and pathways. It is our role as a school to ensure that every student, and their parents and carers, have access to good quality information about future study options and labour market opportunities. All students should understand the complete range of learning opportunities that are available to them. These include both academic and vocational pathways.

At Nuriootpa High School we aim to inspire every student to achieve their potential and prepare them for their future. The upcoming **Careers Expo**, **Curriculum Expo** and **Course Counselling Days** are important elements of this preparation as students need to think critically about their future pathways and how they can achieve these. As parents/caregivers, you have an important role in these conversations and decisions. As students progress to the Senior Years of schooling, subject choices become even more important to ensure their subject choices align with their intended future pathway and meet the SACE requirements.

When choosing subjects, evidence suggests that students should select subjects that:

- enable them to work to their strengths
- are challenging
- they enjoy studying
- provide the qualifications or background knowledge they need for the future and keep their options open

It is important that they do not choose subjects because a friend is or because as parents/caregivers we think they should study a certain subject.

We look forward to working with you over the next few weeks on this critical aspect of your student's future.

SPORT UPDATE

Year 12 student Tyshia Skuse has been selected in the Australian under 19 Women's Lacrosse Team to travel to USA and Canada to compete against other countries in the strongest division in the world.

Tyshia began playing Lacrosse when she was just 9 years of age, following in her father and grandfathers footsteps. She plays goalie for the North Adelaide Lacrosse Club, so she directs the defence, saves goals and clears the ball out to get it into her teams attacking area. Tyshia feels confident when she gets to come out of the cage and take on a field player for a ground ball and run it down the field. In her young career so far, Tyshia has played in three Under 15 State Teams, captained the last two and won the National Title in 2016. She has also played in three Under 18 State Teams who won the National Title in 2019, awarded the Under 17 Gomer Trophy for Sportswomen of the Year in 2017, three Best and Fairest Awards, three MVP Awards, two Best Team Person Awards for her club and of course a member of the Under 19 2019 Australian Women's Team.

Tyshia will leave for USA on July 23rd, where she will have a three day training camp at a University; from there she will travel to Canada with her team for the World Championships which starts August 1st to 14th. The National Team will compete against different countries in their division, coming up against the best countries in the world in America and Canada. Australia has a reputation for being in the Top 3 every year and has brought home the gold on many occasions. Within the team there are 6 South Australian girls including Tyshia, 7 Victorian girls, 6 Western Australian girls, and 1 member living in the USA.

Tyshia is a dedicated and committed member of the team, traveling for two training sessions a week for state and national teams, on top of two more club trainings and two games on Saturdays. Tyshia also undertakes strength and conditioning programs consisting of three planned runs a week to improve endurance and speed, along with two planned gym sessions that take just over an hour. At the conclusion of her Year 12 studies, Tyshia would like to take some time off from schooling so playing for a college in the USA isn't an immediate aspiration of hers; however Tyshia stated "anything can happen after the World Cup though", with scouts and recruitment officers being present she won't be opposed to trying out if the offer was there.

On behalf of Nuriootpa High school and the broader Barossa Valley community, I would like to wish Tyshia the best of luck in USA and Canada and look forward to hearing about her future accomplishments in the sport of Lacrosse.
