Sarah's Update

One of the programs that has positive student involvement is the Anti-bullying Project, this program is being run in partnership with Youth Advisory Council South Australia (YACSA). This project has allowed different aged FLC students to take part and attend meetings and planning sessions to ensure that bullying is taken seriously. The program is continuing into this term with a meeting scheduled for Week 2.

In Term 3 there was a focus on developing students' understanding about sexual health and positive relationships with the support of case managers, teachers and SSO's. During Term 4, the Sammy D Foundation will be presenting a talk to the FLC students and staff about the effects of drug use. The FLC has also had an outreach counselling service from Streetlink available for interested students each fortnight, this will continue into Term 4.


Cooking with Sarah
