These responses will now inform the next part of our improvement journey by working with faculty leaders.

At the training and development this week, staff worked in faculties to review their reading aloud activities in their classes. They discussed successes and challenges. The faculties then went deeper with the area of differentiation they will focus on as a faculty.

Key Points from Governing Council Meeting

- There was an open meeting for families to attend to discuss the Materials and Services fee there were no attendees. The fees were set at \$498 and have gone to poll.
- A draft deficit budget of \$552,904 was approved by Governing Council. This was an additional \$100,000 than recommended by Finance Committee as Governing Council are keen to upgrade the grounds, especially the area adjacent to the year 7 Quads. The final budget will not be approved until the first meeting in 2023 as it will be based on actual rather than predicted student enrolment. Note the poll is currently open for parents to respond. Parents will have \$100 per student reimbursed by the government for full fee paying students.
- Student Awards Working party to reconvene early next year to develop clarity about the criteria
- Uniform Committee to meet in week 4 to review prices of all items and make recommendations to Finance and Governing Council

Year 11 Australian Grain Technologies Excursion

The Year 11 Ag class visited Australian Grain Technologies (AGT) at Roseworthy on Friday 23/9. This facility is the largest plant breeding facility of its kind in the southern hemisphere, where the company focuses on the breeding and development of new wheat, barley, canola and lupin varieties.

Students toured the multi-million dollar facility, which included a state-of-the-art-glasshouse, accelerated environment rooms (for accelerated growth and gene stabilisation of varieties of interest), the machinery shed, grain storage facility, quality control testing lab, milling, and dough/baking testing labs.

A huge thank you to Stuart from AGT for taking the time to show us around, and teach students about the importance and science that goes into breeding new varieties of grain!







Reading Restaurant

Towards the end of Term 3, a 'Reading Restaurant' was set up in the library for Mrs Centenera's Year 8 and Year 9 English classes.
