- Open Day last Wednesday of term 1 - There were a large number of families in attendance to hear about our school and do a tour. Thanks to the SRC students who participated – great to have their voice.
- Pastoral Care Worker Review (PCW) – it was great to have an opportunity to be part of the review of our PCW Vicki. Having the opportunity to reflect on what Vicki does was rewarding - we appreciate her contribution to our school.
- Parent Teacher Interviews – this evening went very well. It was fantastic to talk with so many positive parents. There was positive feedback.
- Congratulations to Ella Mickan who has again been appointed Team Manager of the School Sport SA 12 years and under Australian Football - Girls team for 2024, which will compete in Geelong from 3 to 10 August 2024.
- Stage 2 Workplace Practices and Industry Connections Excursion to the Career Expo – Naomi Timms and Anne-Marie Reichstein took 33 Year 12's to the expo and in Naomi's words 'the students made us proud. They were respectful, engaged and most of all, participated in the experiences to benefit their futures by connecting and conversing with people who could help them forge forward into their bright futures. They were so awesome!' Anne-Marie shared that one student was offered an apprenticeship in carpentry, another has an interview for a traineeship in Child Care and another has applied for an apprenticeship on Saturday with Komatsu! She shared that during the next lesson, the students were really enthusiastic about the information they gained from the Career Expo and it prompted many of them to also seriously consider new pathways.

New Waste Management Process

From the beginning of this term, there has been a new waste management process at our school.

School Mental Health Practitioner

There are currently interviews and reference checks. If there is a successful applicant, we are hoping they will commence in term 3. The school is guaranteed a 2-year role.

Pupil Free Day Tuesday Week 7 Term 2

Teachers will engage in 2 separate moderation sessions with Kapunda High School staff until 12 noon. From 12 noon – 1pm there will be a faculty session to debrief the learnings from the morning.

In the afternoon, teachers will further their work on the Australian Curriculum version 9 – for some faculties this will include looking at the recently released information about the 'South Australian' context of this work.

Curriculum SSOs will participate in a session facilitated by the Gawler Education Office.

PAC Proposal re Use of Complexity Funding \$100,960

Each year schools are provided with Complexity Funds with PAC proposing how to use them and then seeking agreement from staff. The following proposal was agreed by staff:

- Mainstream, FLC and IEC: 10 hours per week X SSO for each group \$51,963
- Proposal from Nat Noack re Reading Intervention to support identified students 12 hours per week x SSO for Literacy training
- \$1,200 for staff training in Literacy Program \$219,85
- Balance for One Plans \$27,012 (about 45 TRT days).

There is currently a process happening to appoint an SSO to undertake the Reading Intervention work.

Further update re our Site Improvement Plan

Since the information that was provided to all families about our progress with our Improvement Plan, there has been some further work:

- On Monday of this week, 4 teachers shared how they have gained feedback and the impact it has had on their teaching. This is in preparation for all teachers and curriculum SSOs to survey one class to gain feedback before the end of this semester (week 8). This was a very powerful session as the teachers ranged from very experienced to a new teacher. During our week 6 staff meeting, teachers and curriculum SSOs will have time to work collaboratively on preparing their own feedback questions/process.

- Positive Behaviours for Learning – teachers and curriculum SSOs will begin this training with staff from the Gawler Education Office at staff meetings in weeks 2, 5 and 8 of term 3. This will provide an opportunity for work between these sessions.

GOVERNING COUNCIL REPORT

Governing Council Meeting

Items discussed and approved at the meeting included:

- Progress against the Site Improvement Plan – Governing Council finalised how they are spending the Parents In Education Grant and asked the school to organise these sessions. The Council asked that the whole progress against the Bullying Prevention work be shared with all parents in a separate communication. This was done on Friday May 18th through DayMap and SMS message and followed up with an email on Monday May 20th. Please note that the session for parents 'Carly Ryan Foundation' will deliver a parent information session open to all years 7-12 families. The parent workshop discusses many of the themes covered in the student workshop, but with the intention of empowering parents with the skills and knowledge they need to navigate parenting kids in the borderless online world. The Foundation allows 1.5 hours to share with parents the latest research and issues affecting kids online and how they can help make the experience healthy and positive. During the session there are practical opportunities to develop skills parents can use to create balanced and safer internet use at home and on the move.
- This workshop has been scheduled for **Wednesday July 3rd at 5:30pm**. Further information will follow.
- Staff Car Park – there continues to be work on this as the state government has informed our department that there must be 76 more carparks on our grounds. Much work is happening about the location of these parks.
- Governing Council to have a direct email – currently exploring how this will work.
- Student toilet upgrade -plans are approved to upgrade the toilets in Open Space and Memorial Hall to become individual cubicles with exterior doors similar to the new toilets in the Quad area. The broad timeline for this work is:
 - Weeks 2 -7 term 2 will be documentation and final drawings
 - Weeks 8 – 10 to tender
 - Holidays - tenders evaluated and work will hopefully then begin sometime in term 3.

School Card covers \$379 of the Materials & Services Charge. The additional \$131 of Material & Services charge will be waived if School Card is approved. *Families must apply for School Card annually.*

Don't leave these financial matters too late as per the Nuriootpa High School Debt Collection Policy all outstanding charges for 2024 will be sent to the Recoveries Unit at the Attorney General Office.

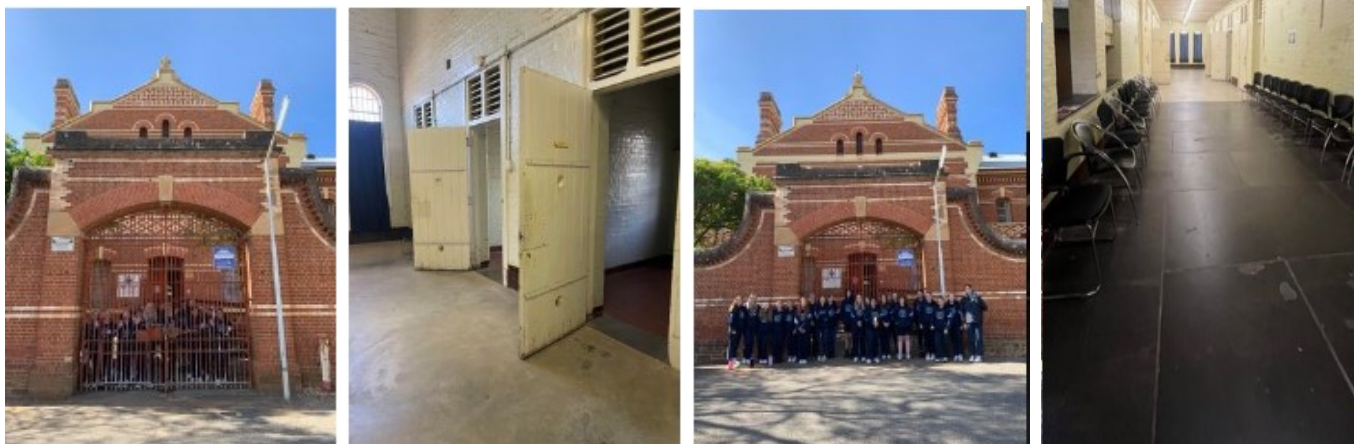

YEAR 12 PSYCHOLOGY GLENSIDE WARD Z VISIT

Mrs Hausler's year 12 psychology class toured the Z Ward in Glenside as part of our finished Psychological Health and Wellbeing unit of work. The Ward was operational from 1888-1973 and held criminals who were deemed 'criminally insane'. Our tour guide Gaile was fantastic and the students were able to explore the ward and what life would have been like for the those held here. We also learnt about the connections between the stigma of mental health at the time in comparison to now, and how that has influenced the closing down of the ward. The students were excellent, with both our tour guide and a member of another tour commenting on how wonderful and respectful they were! A big thank you to Mr Sheridan for driving the bus today.



YEAR 11 AGRICULTURE - DAYS EGGS VISIT

On Thursday 11th April, senior agriculture students had the opportunity to visit Days Eggs, a world class layer chicken and egg grading facility located at Lower Light. Students learned about the history of the company, who they supply eggs for, the different types of egg laying production systems, farm size/locations, biosecurity, and animal welfare and production technologies that were integrated into the farms. Throughout the tour, we were shown through the warehouse and state of the art grading facility that can grade, detect imperfections, discard, wash, and pack up to 127,000 eggs per hour!

Students were also shown a newly built shed, housing 20,000 chickens, and learned about the systems and technology used to maintain high production and animal welfare standards.
