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## From the Principal By Roy Page

### Principal update

Term 3 is a bustling time at schools, and Nuriootpa High is no exception. Our Year 12 students are diligently completing external and school-based assessments and shifting their focus to exam preparation. Meanwhile, students from Years 7 to 11 have made their subject selections for 2025 and we are actively engaging with local primary schools to welcome our incoming Year 7 cohort.

Transition days for Year 6 students are scheduled for December 5th and 6th, promising exciting new beginnings.

This term, we've also embarked on an introspective review of various policies and processes within our school:

- **Mobile Phone Policy Review:**

A special thanks to the parents and students who engaged in the review facilitated by Neil White at the start of the term. The feedback was clear: our policy is largely effective, though some aspects need better communication and enforcement. Concerns were raised about the rationale behind the policy, with some noting how Nuriootpa High's approach differs from other schools Statewide. It's important to remember that the mobile phone ban is a government mandate for all secondary schools. Our approach at Nuriootpa High balances trust and responsibility, allowing students to keep their phones in their bags rather than locked away, fostering a culture of mutual respect and collective responsibility.

- **Internal Self-Evaluation:**

Guided by principles of trust and respect, we are reviewing our Universal Behavioural Expectations, pedagogical approaches, and curriculum documentation. This reflection is crucial as we develop our next strategic plan. During weeks 5 and 6, our Leadership Team conducted learning walks in 49 Year 7 and 8 classrooms, gathering insights to inform our future directions and professional learning priorities.

- **Professional Development Focus:**

Our most recent student-free day centred on implementing our positive behaviour for learning framework, enhancing student mental health support, and delving into the South Australian Curriculum's latest updates. Our teaching staff has shown remarkable dedication and creativity in updating their units to align with Australian Curriculum version 9 and the nuances of the SA Curriculum, all set for 2025.

I am thrilled by the enthusiasm and expertise of our teachers in refining our educational approach which promises to boost student engagement over time.

Unfortunately, the recent search for a new Principal did not result in a hire, leading to a re-advertisement of the position on a national level. Brent Bloffwitch will be the Acting Principal in Term 4.

My time at Nuriootpa High School has been profoundly fulfilling, and I am confident that the school's momentum will continue under its skilled leadership team and devoted staff.

## **SCHOOL CARD ASSISTANCE**

School Card is available in government schools to:

- Families with children aged 4 years and over who attend a school full time
- Independent full time students studying year 10, 11 or 12
- Adult re-entry students undertaking subjects to complete their SACE

To qualify, your family's gross income in the 2022/23 financial year must be below the threshold, based on the number of dependent children you have in your family.

School Card covers \$379 of the Materials & Services Charge. The additional \$131 of Material & Services Charge will be waived if School Card is approved. Families must apply for School Card annually.

Don't leave these financial matters too late. As per the Nuriootpa High School Debt Collection Policy, all outstanding charges for 2024 will be sent to the Recoveries Unit at the Attorney General Office.

We thank all the families that have already attended to the above payments, these help our students to undertake the fundamental elements of their educational programs.

### **Now is the time to claim ABSTUDY for your high school child**



ABSTUDY is a group of payments for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Australians. ABSTUDY helps with the costs of studying or doing an Australian Apprenticeship.

It can help with your child's school fees, boarding costs, travel to and from school and other school items. If your child's travel is impacted by COVID-19 or they need to study remotely, ABSTUDY can also help.

If you're a parent or guardian and your child is younger than 16, you should claim on their behalf. If your child is 16 and over, or independent, they can claim themselves. To claim, call the Services Australia's ABSTUDY line on Freecall 1800 132 317.

If they're starting uni or TAFE, they'll be able to claim online through myGov.

Claiming before 1 December means ABSTUDY payments can be finalised in time for the start of school next year. This is very important if your child needs to move away from home to study.

## NHS ROYAL ADELAIDE SHOW STEER SUCCESS

### **Nuriootpa High School Steers into Success at the Royal Adelaide Show**

Nuriootpa High School kicked off an impressive showing at the Royal Adelaide Show with standout performances in the steer competitions. In the highly competitive Schools Light Domestic category (200-250kg), the school's Granite Ridge steer, Dipsy, secured 4th place, while in the Schools Export category (300-350kg), their Hearnden Farms steer, Tinky Winky, achieved 5th place. The students' dedication to preparing their steers and presenting them in top condition was clear, making the school proud as they steered their way to success.

Angela L, also impressed in the Urrbrae Agricultural High School Handler competition, maintaining an excellent connection with her steer despite not taking home a ribbon. The students worked hard to ensure the steers and their pens were well presented throughout the competition, and their efforts truly paid off.

### **Dairy Judging Success**

In the Junior Dairy Judging competition, Riley V claimed first place, with Ruby P securing third place. In the Senior Dairy Judging, Maxwell S and Caleb G both made it into the top eight with impressive oral presentations, showcasing a level of expertise well beyond their years.

### **Grain Judging Victory**

Nick R took first place in Senior Pulses Grain Judging, particularly excelling in bean evaluation. His sharp focus and understanding of the crop earned him the top spot in a highly competitive field.

### **Soil Judging Triumph**

Maxwell S, Oscar S, and Caleb G, displayed an impressive grasp of soil science, taking first place in the Soil Judging competition. Their in-depth knowledge of soil texture, type, and pH levels was evident as they applied their learning from Chemistry, Biology, and Agriculture studies to the competition. A special mention went to Ruby P, George P, Riley F, and Riley V, who also placed a commendable fourth.

### **Sheep and Wool Judging**

The Sheep and Wool Judging events were fiercely contested, with 133 entries for wool and 163 for sheep. Grace S, earned second place in fleece judging, while Maddy S, made the top eight in both senior fleece and sheep judging with strong oral presentations. Their hard work and dedication clearly paid off. Nuriootpa High School was given the opportunity to be interviewed by BTN which was shown on Thursday the 6<sup>th</sup> of September – the interview can be accessed on the schools Facebook, ABC IView or YouTube.

### **Photography and Judging Recognition**

Kiara S, not only contributed through her judging efforts but also captured the day's events with her photography, helping to document the students' success.

### **Outstanding School Achievements**

Nuriootpa High School's Sheep Club performed admirably, with both of its teams making the top 20 out of 77 schools. The school also earned second place in the prestigious "Most Professional School" award, scoring 79 out of 80, just behind Urrbrae Agricultural High School. Their continued success from last year, where they placed second in their zone with a fleece score of 73.3 out of 100, highlighted the consistent effort and dedication of the students and staff involved.

The week concluded with Beef Judging and Parading, where Nuriootpa High School's students continued to compete in the Merino SA School Wethers Competition, dairy cattle judging, soil judging, and grain judging. With 77 teams entered in the Wethers Competition, it proved to be a challenging and exciting event.

### **Champion Recognition**

A standout achievement came from George P, who earned a Championship ribbon for his grain entries in the junior section. His success reflected the school's ongoing commitment to excellence in agricultural education.

With 123 entries across various categories, the students of Nuriootpa High School made their mark at the Royal Adelaide Show. The school community now eagerly awaits the wine competition results in November, which will round out what has been a remarkable year for the school.

## WEAR IT PURPLE DAY

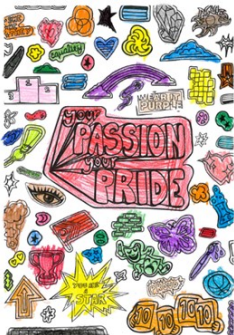
