Context Statement

Nuriootpa High School caters for students from 7-12. At the time of this report, the enrolment in 2024 is 1202. Nuriootpa High School is classified as Category 5 on the Department for Education Index of Educational Disadvantage. At the time of this report, the school population includes 3% Aboriginal students, 13% students with disabilities, 2% children/young people in care. Governing Council Report

This was my first year as Governing Council Chairperson for the Nuriootpa High School Governing Council, I am pleased to present this report which summarises our key activities for 2024 and our future directions.

Our first meeting in February 2024 included a review of the Site Improvement Plan for 2024 and the installation of increased security cameras around the school. We were proud to hear of the wonderful accomplishments of the 2023 year 12 students and we learnt about the staff leadership team for 2024.

We held 8 regular meetings throughout the year and called an extraordinary meeting too to review the constitution and voice our continued support for the school.

During this reporting period we made significant progress in several areas.

A staff car park is required, following a response from transport, throughout the year we have discussed various options for its site, no decision has yet been finalised but we are conscious of keeping trees and not reducing sporting areas. The shade over the IEC playground has been installed and the area is now functional. Upgrade of the toilet block, movement of the rainwater tanks and upgrading of the tennis courts have been items that we have focused on together with extra shade for the students.

A parent in education grant was achieved and as an adjunct to our anti bullying policy we achieved some sessions for all students and their care givers with Dollys Dream or the Carly Ryan Foundation.

We were involved in the planning and implementation of the Governing Council page on the Nuriootpa High School internet page with the governing council email address so that we are contactable.

In June we were involved in the external independent review of Nuriootpa High School and met with the review team to provide our feedback. We have guided & been part of the selection process for a new principal following Gerri Walker taking leave.

Our SRC President Travis and SRC Vice President Krystal visited at each meeting. They discussed fundraising plans for the year and the SRCs key priorities – positive school culture, rubbish and student mental health. Both students should be very proud of the work they have done this year and the wonderful contribution they have made to Nuriootpa High School.

I would like to acknowledge the amazing people that have worked with me this year on Governing Council, we are representatives on the canteen committee, the uniform committee, the finance committee, the wine committee and the buildings and grounds committee. We continue to be involved in the direction of site improvements and fundraising. We approve the schools learning plan, the school fees and the budget in an attempt to improve things for our children. We do not always agree but we are all there to promote diversity, equity and inclusion of all children.




NAPLAN Proficiency



Attendance Comment

In South Australia, all children and young people must be in school from 6 years to 16 years old. They must attend a government or non-government school full time. From age 16 to 17 however, young people must attend school or an approved learning program (such as an apprenticeship, traineeship, accredited course or university). Schools and parents must encourage and support students to come to school every day. Parents and caregivers must make sure their child is enrolled in a school, and attends school all day and everyday it is open, unless a child is sick or has an approved exemption. Teachers and leaders actively follow up when a student misses school, including recording all absences and non-attendance. All schools in South Australia have local attendance procedures governed under the Education and Children's Services Regulations 2020.
