MATERIALS AND SERVICES CHARGE 2025

The 2025 Materials and Services Charge is **\$510** per student as set by the Governing Council. The school community was polled in November 2025 and the majority supported that **the full \$510 per student is payable and legally recoverable unless parents/caregivers are eligible for school card. The \$200 Government rebate reduces the amount to \$310.**

Full payment is due by **Friday 14 February 2025** unless you intend to pay by instalments.

DEPARTMENT FOR EDUCATION GOVERNMENT REBATE FOR 2024

A \$200 rebate (discount) from the Government is available for parents, carers and independent students who are required to pay the 2025 M&S Charge. The Department for Education have advised that the \$200 rebate and any remaining credits from 2024 **must** be applied to the 2025 M&S charges. The Finance Office will apply the 2025 and any 2024 remaining credits and you will only need to pay the statement balance. Statements will be posted at the end of January.

MATERIALS AND SERVICES CHARGES PAYMENT OPTIONS

Option 1: Pay in Full

- **Pay in full by due date Friday 14 February, 2025** by cash, cheque, Eftpos at the Finance Office, credit card over the phone or deposit via the school bank account BSB (105-055) Account number **233809740** using your family code or invoice number as the reference.

Option 2: Payment by Instalment

SCHOOL CARD ASSISTANCE 2024

School Card covers \$396 of the Materials & Services Charge. The additional \$114 of Material & Services fee will be waived if School Card is approved. Families must apply for School Card annually and lodge an application at the school where the student attends.

The Form A School Card form is based solely on the number of dependent children and income for the last financial year. School Card Form A (when available) will be on the NHS website <http://www.nurihs.sa.edu.au> where you can **apply online** or print a hardcopy. The completed form can be emailed to dl.0788.finance@schools.sa.edu.au, posted or returned to the Finance Office. This should be done as soon as possible at the start of the year.

Form A is based solely on the number of dependent children and income for the last financial year. This may not be the correct form for you as there are other ways that you may meet the requirements to be eligible for school card assistance such as hardship, change of circumstance, self-employed, foster children and independent youth allowance. The NHS website has the link to access forms (via the SA GOV website) required to apply for assistance under these circumstances or contact the Finance Office and the relevant form can be sent to you. If you consider that you may be eligible for School Card please complete the form that best meets your circumstance and return it to the Finance Office as early as possible after the commencement of the 2025 school year. If you are unsure of your eligibility and require further assistance please contact the Finance Office. **If you are found to be ineligible for School Card then you are liable to pay the Materials & Services Charge of \$510 (less the \$200 Government rebate).**

DEBT RECOVERY POLICY

The school's Governing Council expects the Materials and Services Charges will be paid in full by 14 **February 2025** unless families have applied for School Card or have arranged to pay by instalment. If an application for School Card has not been made or there is no instalment plan in place, any outstanding debts will be forwarded to the Department for Education for debt collection by the Attorney General's Department.

OTHER CHARGES

Subject Costs

Some subjects do have costs in addition to the Materials & Services Charge. These costs are outlined in the Curriculum Guide 2025 subject descriptions. This guide is on the Nuriootpa High School web page under Programs. Invoices will be sent home as these costs occur. If you have an enquiry about the subject or the cost please contact the subject co-ordinator.

Music Program

All students who study Music from year 9 onwards must either be learning an instrument through a recognised teacher outside of school or enrol in the school's instrumental program at the beginning of the year. Instrumental music programs for flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, guitar, bass guitar, drums and voice are available at school. Piano and keyboard lessons are offered through a private provider here at school and as such a fee is charged directly by the teacher.

Musical Instrument Hire

The cost of hiring a musical instrument will depend on the instrument. Nuriootpa High School will use an external hire provider such as Size Music and the fees are set by the company. Families are responsible for the full hire amount. Instruments are issued to the student after hire fees have been paid. Drums, guitar, piano/keyboard and bass guitar are not hired but students require access to these instruments at home to practice.

Students participating in Instrumental Music lessons will be required to participate in concerts and ensembles which can include choir, concert band, year level ensembles, guitar ensembles, woodwind ensembles or percussion ensemble.

VET

VET stands for Vocational Education and Training. VET is education and training that gives students skills for work, particularly in the trades and industry. In other words, VET is education and training that gives students skills and knowledge for work. It is the kind of education offered by TAFE colleges and a range of other registered training organisations. Students have the opportunity to undertake VET as part of the South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE).

There is a cost to the parent and this will be advised when the student is enrolled in the program.

CALCULATORS

It is a requirement that all mathematics students have their own calculators. The use of a calculator on Mobile phones is not allowed as they do not have the required functionality.

Scientific Calculators

The following Mathematics courses require students to have their own **Scientific calculator**.

- All Year 8, 9 and 10 students
- Year 11 Essential Mathematics students

Note: Year 10 Mathematics A (second semester) students may wish to purchase their own **Graphics Calculator**. These will be required for Stage 1 and 2 General Mathematics, Mathematical Methods and Specialist Mathematics. Please see below for more information.

Students can order a new **Scientific calculator** online through Abacus Calculators, see the Scientific Calculator order form on the school website, under the School Information page. Their current new price is \$30.00 (GST inclusive), with the optional extra of protective padded case at \$6.00 (GST Inclusive) and extended five year warranty. There is no profit for the school. Calculators will be delivered to the school for the start of the school year.

Graphics Calculators

The following Mathematics courses **require** students to have their own **Graphics calculator**.

- Year 11 General Mathematics (Students studying a full year with the intention of doing Stage 2 General Mathematics)
- All Year 11 Mathematical Methods/Specialist Mathematics
- All Year 12 Mathematics students

The schools preferred **Graphics calculator** models (SACE approved) are as follows:

- Casio Fx-CG50 AU (Latest model)
- Casio Fx-CG20 AU
- Casio Fx-9860G AU Plus

Please be aware that older models do not have the same functionality or processing power.

Students can order a new **Scientific or Graphic Calculators** online through Abacus Calculators; see the Graphics Calculator order form on the school website, under the School Information page. Their current new price is \$266.00 (GST inclusive), including a padded case and extended two year warranty. There is no profit for the school. Calculators will be delivered to the school for the start of the school year.

If you intend to source your Graphics calculator elsewhere please ensure it is one of the above mentioned models. Please be aware that some other models are NOT approved by the SACE board and cannot be used for tests and exams.

DONATIONS
